





The town is on the northern side of the Dingle Peninsula, and is the largest town in County Kerry, situated along the world renowned Wild Atlantic Way. It has a population of 24,000, is a friendly, student town and the gateway to Dingle and beautiful beaches of North Kerry.

Dingle

Dingle is a beautiful fishing village, just under 50 kilometres from Tralee. Dingle has a small population of around 2,000 residents and is situated in an Irish speaking 'Gaeltacht' region. It is a hive of activity in the summer and kept busy in the winter with varied and interesting festivals. It recently attracted worldwide interest as a filming location for the Star Wars film franchise, on World Heritage site Skellig Michael. Dingle forms part of the stunning Wild Atlantic Way coastal route.



Cork

Cork, Ireland's second largest city (just 1.5 hours drive from Tralee through beautiful countryside) is a university city with its centre on an island in the River Lee, connected to the sea by Cork Harbour. The castlelike 1824 Cork City Gaol once held prisoners bound for Australia, and exhibitions relay the building's history. The hilltop steeple of 18th-century Shandon Church (officially the Church of Saint Anne) is a symbol of the city. Students enjoy spending a day shopping (usually on Saturday) and wandering through this beautiful city which has a small town feel to it with lots of character and charm.




